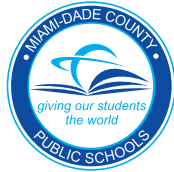
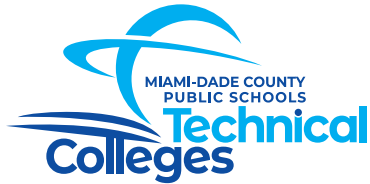

## Program Outlook

Many welding processes have been developed and refined to fuse newer and stronger metal combinations. New processes are still needed for metal, ceramic and plastic parts. Skilled welders will continue to be in demand in the future. A career in welding can be learned in a variety of educational settings, such as in high school, at a trade school, in a college or university, in the military, or in an apprenticeship program.

## Length of Program

The average length of this program is 1,050 hours (approximately 12 months) for adult students attending part time. Actual time is dependent upon enrollment status and the length of time the student requires to achieve competencies. This program contains occupational completion points designed to prepare students for a position.

## Entrance Requirements

Students must be at least 16 years old and not attending high school, application, and interview by a guidance counselor. Fees for supplies and textbooks are required.
